Introduction

1. This is the fourth report in the “Resources for Results” series, published by the United Nations Office of the Special Envoy on Ebola. It provides an overview of the funding pledged and disbursed by contributing partners to support Ebola response, recovery and research efforts. Further, it reports on funds expended by recipient entities involved in responding to the outbreak in the three affected countries of Guinea, Liberia and Sierra Leone.
2. The content is based primarily on the responses of contributing partners and recipients to a request for information sent by the Office of the United Nations Special Envoy on Ebola in late-May and early-June 2015. In instances where a response was not provided, information about contributing partner funding contained in the previous report in the series, “Resources for Results III”, dated February 2015 (updated on 7 April 2015),¹ is reflected in this report.
3. The report is divided into two sections. The first summarises the data reported by contributing partners and the second provides a summary of the data reported by recipients.
4. The report covers the period 1 September 2014 to 31 May 2015.² All figures reflect USD millions unless otherwise indicated. Where contributing partners or recipients provided information in another currency, conversions were made on the basis of the prevailing exchange rate applicable in June 2015.

A. Funds pledged and disbursed by contributing partners

5. In response to the request for information sent by the United Nations Special Envoy on Ebola, a total of 25 contributing partners provided data on their financial contribution to the Ebola response, recovery and research effort. These contributing partners consisted of 19 governments,³ three international financial institutions,⁴ two foundations⁵ and one regional organisation.⁶ To enable the compilation of a more comprehensive picture, information from a further 20 contributing partners, comprising 15 governments,⁷ three foundations⁸ and two international financial institutions⁹, was drawn from “Resources for Results III”. Information about funds pledged by the African Union, in particular the African Union Support to the Ebola Outbreak in West Africa (ASEOWA), were obtained via that organisation’s website.

6. Contributing partners were requested to report on the amount of funds pledged and disbursed to address the Ebola outbreak. They were further requested to provide breakdowns of these amounts according to:

- The recipient of the funds.
- The geographic allocation of the funds.
- The purpose for which the funds were designated.

7. On the basis of the information made available by contributing partners and the data in ‘Resources for Results III’, this section sets out the following breakdowns of the funds pledged and disbursed:

- Figure A1: Amounts pledged and disbursed, disaggregated according to contributing partner.
- Figure A2: Amounts disbursed, disaggregated according to contributing partner category.

Pledges and Disbursements

8. According to the information about the 46 contributing partners for which data was available, the partners have pledged a total of USD 6.6 billion to address the Ebola outbreak, USD 4.6 billion of which has been disbursed. This reflects an overall disbursement level of 69%. Some contributing partner funds were pledged for periods of time that are yet to fully elapse and others are to be directed to recovery efforts. The United Nations Special Envoy on Ebola continues to liaise with contributing partners to facilitate the disbursement of pledged funds to the areas in which support is most needed. The disbursement level for each category of contributing partners, valid as at 31 May 2015 for the 25 contributing partners that responded to the request for information for this report and as at 31 January for the 20 about whom information was drawn from “Resources for Results III”,¹⁰ is as follows:

- Governments: 83%
- Regional Organisations: 90%
- International Financial Institutions: 42%
- Foundations: 58%

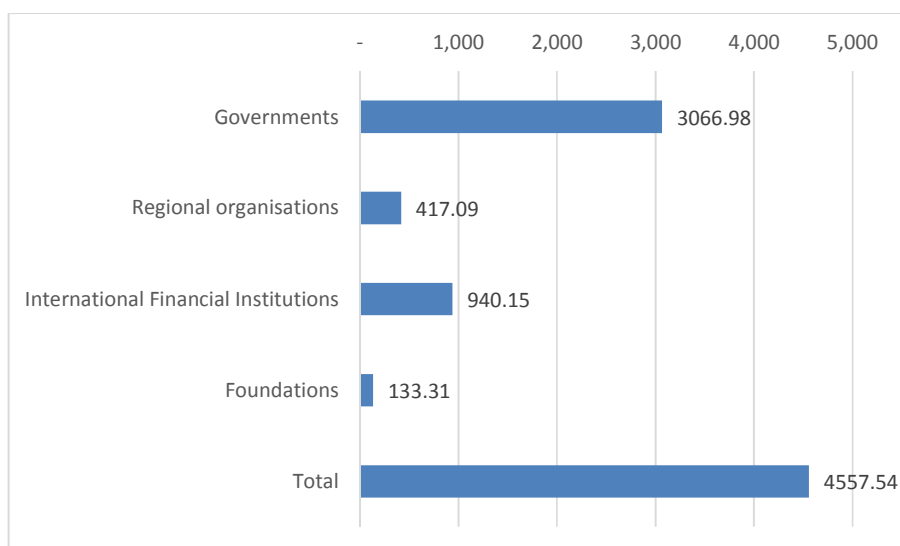

Allocation of disbursed funds by recipient

10. Contributing partners provided information about the recipients to whom funds had been pledged and disbursed. Those recipients were categorised as follows:

- (i) Bilateral assistance to the affected countries.
- (ii) Regional Organisations.
- (iii) International Non-Governmental Organisations (INGOs).
- (iv) Local NGOs based in the affected countries.
- (v) International Organisations.
- (vi) United Nations Ebola Response Multi-Partner Trust Fund (MPTF).
- (vii) Research Institutions.
- (viii) Affected countries through additional IMF assistance.
- (ix) National institutions and departments of contributing partner governments.
- (x) Medevac service providers.
- (xi) “Other Recipient” reflects those funds disbursed by contributing partners that either did not fit into one of the other categories or were disbursed by contributing partners who did not provide specific information about the recipients to whom they disbursed funds.

11. Based on the information made available by contributing partners, the overall allocation of funds disbursed to each category of recipients has been as follows:

- Bilateral assistance to the affected countries: 15%
- Regional Organisations: 1%
- International NGOs: 13%
- Local NGOs: <0.1%
- International Organisations: 22%
- MPTF: 2%
- Research Institutions: 4%
- Affected countries through additional IMF assistance: 6%
- National institutions and departments of contributing partner governments: 30%
- Medevac service providers: <0.1%
- Other recipients:¹¹ 6%

12. Further information about the recipients included in the “Other” category is contained below in the discussions on each of the contributing partner categories.

Figure A4: Amounts disbursed by contributing partner governments, disaggregated according to recipient (USD millions)

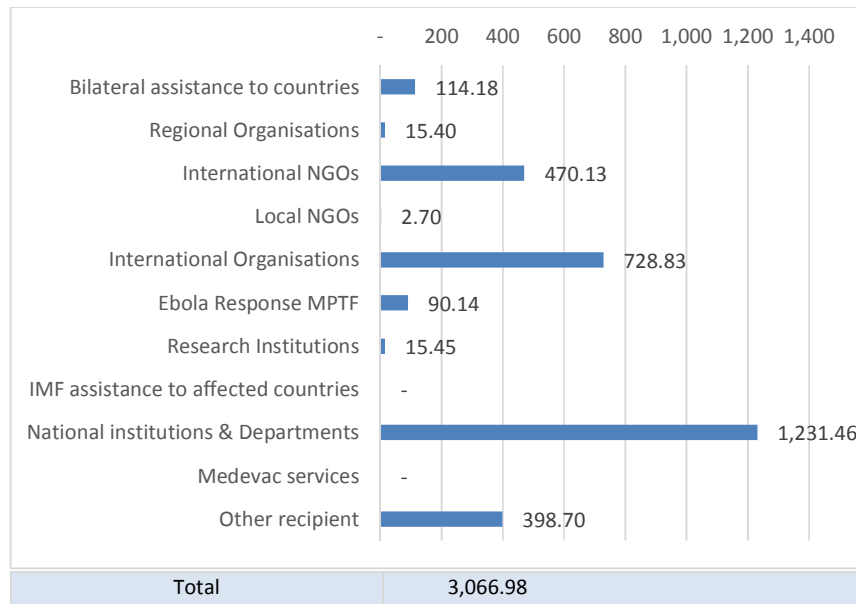
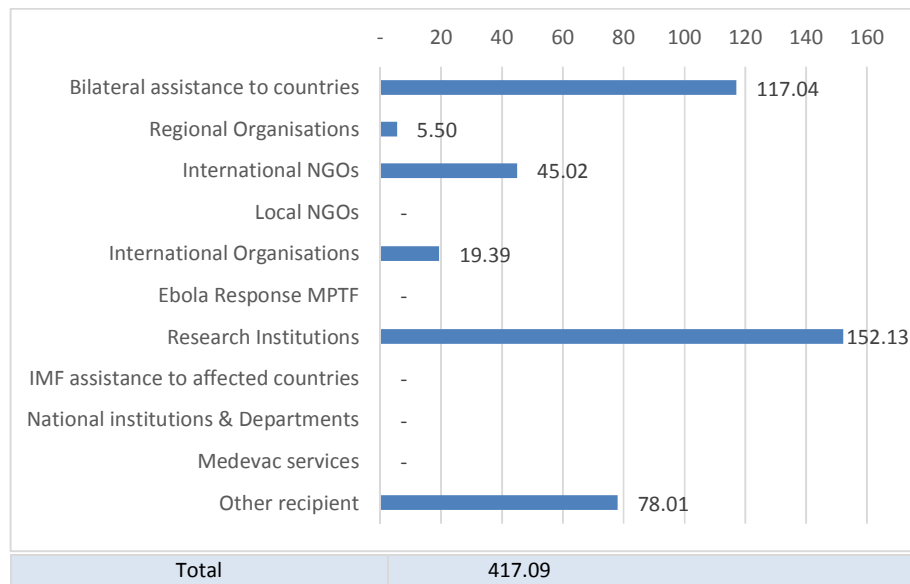


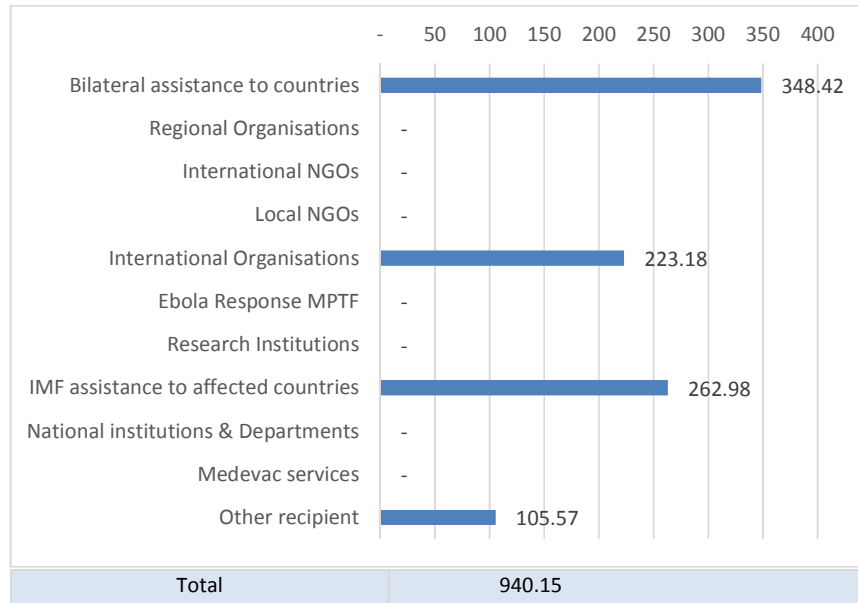
Figure A5: Amounts disbursed by contributing partner regional organisations, disaggregated according to recipient (USD millions)



15. Of the USD 78 million reported as disbursed by contributing partner regional organisations to “Other recipients”, the European Union reported that USD 30.8 million were disbursed to unspecified “UN agencies and NGOs” and USD 17.38 million to unspecified “government and various partners”.

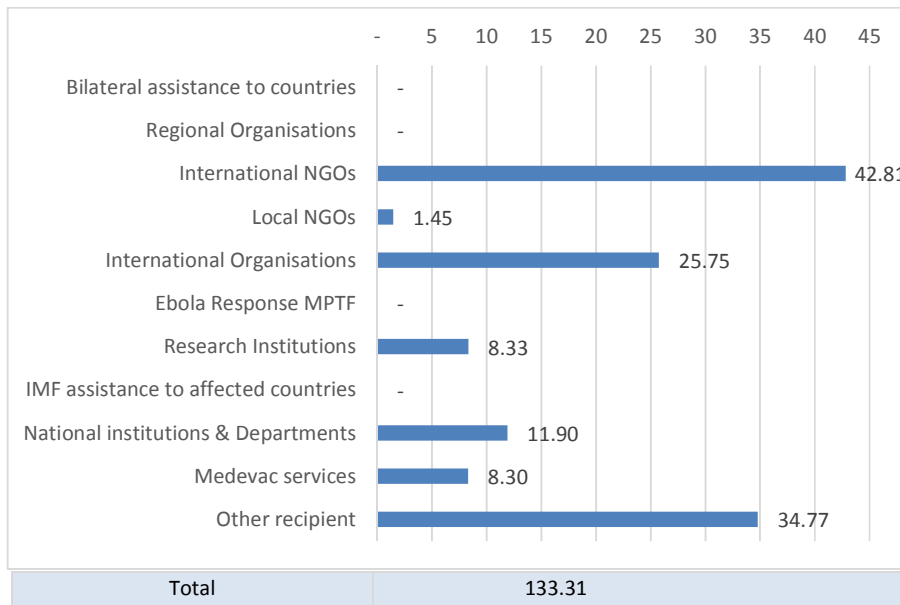


Figure A6: Amounts disbursed by contributing partner international financial institutions, disaggregated according to recipient (USD millions)



16. The IMF reported that USD 111.69 million were disbursed under Extended Credit Facility reviews in Guinea and Liberia, USD 85.43 million were disbursed under the Rapid Credit Facility arrangements in Liberia and Guinea, and USD 65.86 million were disbursed as debt relief under the Catastrophe Containment and Relief Trust in Guinea and Liberia.

Figure A7: Amounts disbursed by contributing partner foundations, disaggregated according to recipient (USD millions)

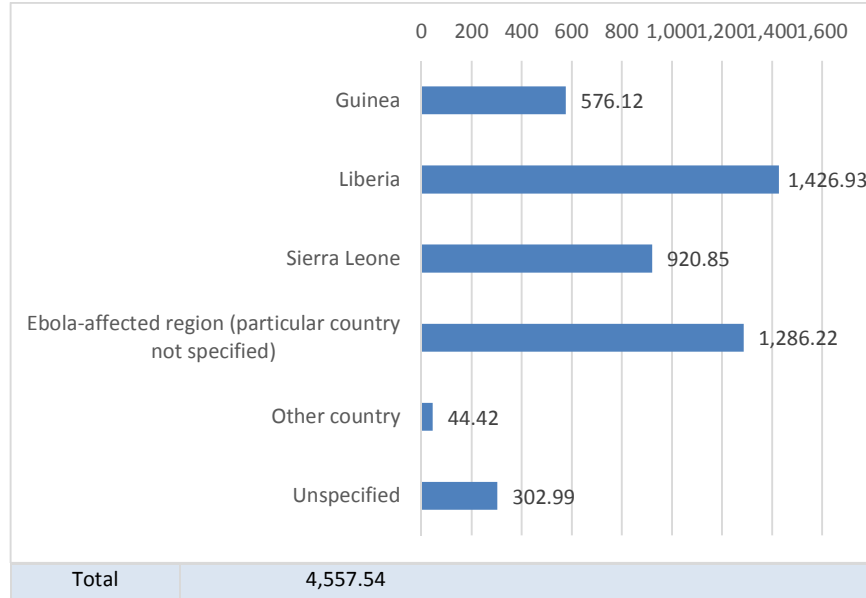


Geographic allocation of disbursed funds

17. Contributing partners provided information on how disbursed funds have been allocated geographically – to Guinea, Liberia, Sierra Leone and other countries. The information provided by contributing partners includes a total of USD 1.286 billion disbursed for use in the Ebola-affected region without specifying the particular Ebola-affected country in which it has been used. The other countries to which contributing partners have disbursed funds include Benin, Cameroon, Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Guinea-Bissau, Niger, Nigeria, Senegal, Mali, and Togo. The overall geographic allocation of funds disbursed by the reporting contributing partners has been as follows:

- Guinea: 13%
- Liberia: 31%
- Sierra Leone: 20%
- Ebola-affected country (particular country not specified): 28%
- Other country: 1%
- Unspecified: 7%

Purpose of disbursed funds

19. Contributing partners provided information about how disbursed funds have been allocated by purpose – either to support the emergency Ebola response effort, the recovery and economic revitalization of affected-countries or the Ebola-related research and development element.

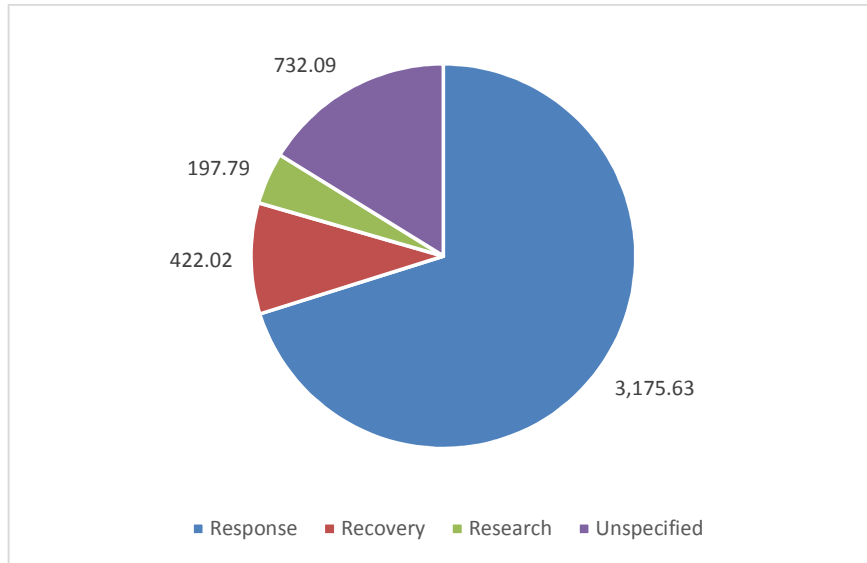
20. The overall allocation of funds disbursed by the reporting contributing partners for each purpose has been as follows:

- Response: 71%
- Recovery: 9%
- Research and development: 4%
- Not specified:¹⁴ 16%

B. Funds expended by recipients

21. Ten recipient entities, in particular United Nations agencies, funds and programs and the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, provided information about the funds they have expended to address the Ebola outbreak, as at 31 May 2015. Unlike the previous section, information from “Resources for Results III” was not used in the information reflected in this section of the report. The ten respondent recipients were:

- Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO)
- International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (IFRC)
- Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA)
- United Nations Children’s Fund (UNICEF)
- United Nations Development Program (UNDP)
- United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empower of Women (UN Women)
- United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR)
- United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA)
- World Food Program (WFP)
- World Health Organization (WHO)

22. The recipients were requested to report on the amount of funds expended to address the Ebola outbreak. They were requested to provide breakdowns of these amounts according



to the geographic allocation of the funds and the Mission Critical Action (MCA)¹⁵ for which the funds were used.

23. On the basis of the information reporting recipients provided, which was valid as of 31 May 2015, this section sets out the following breakdowns of the funds expended:

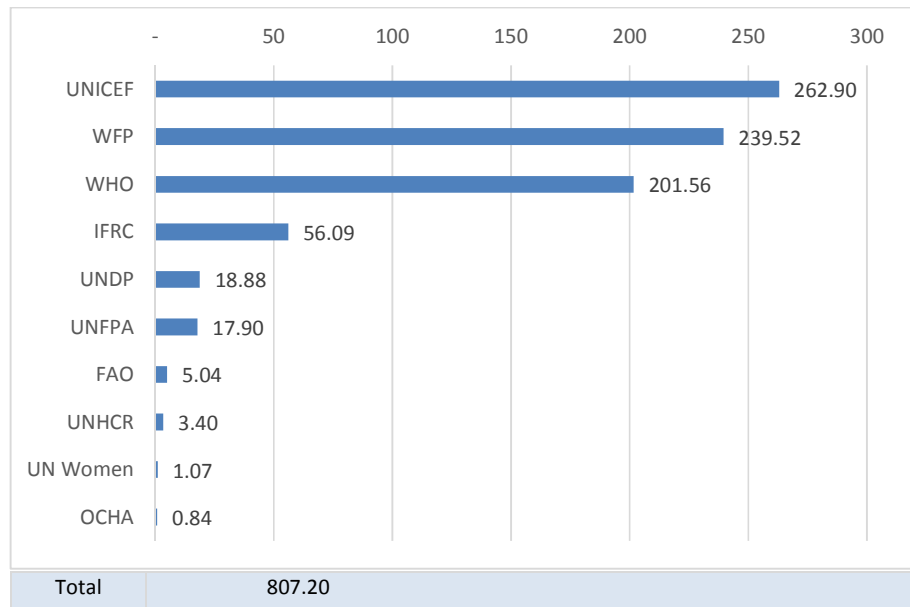

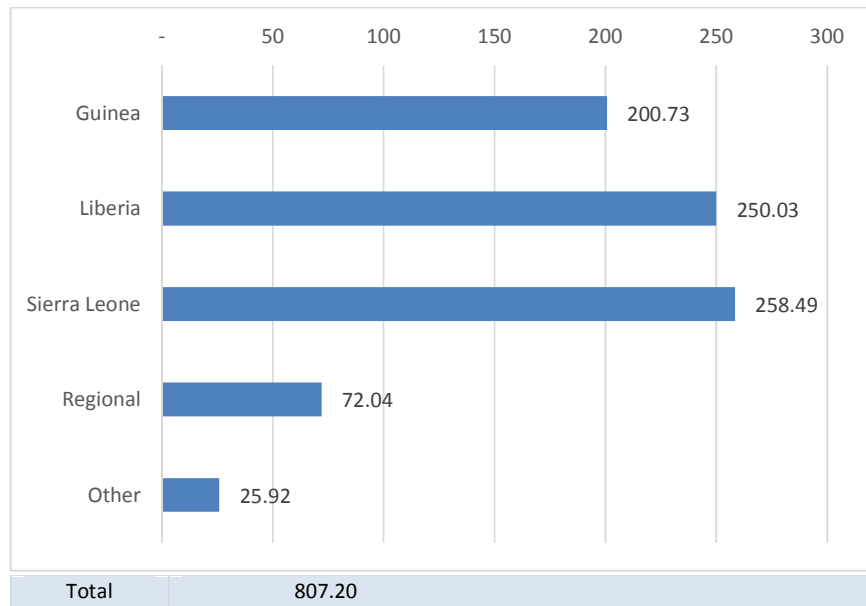


Geographic allocation of expended funds

25. The overall geographic allocation of funds expended by the reporting recipients has been as follows:

- Guinea: 25%
- Liberia: 31%
- Sierra Leone: 32%
- Regionally: 9%
- Other:¹⁶ 3%

Use of funds for Mission Critical Actions

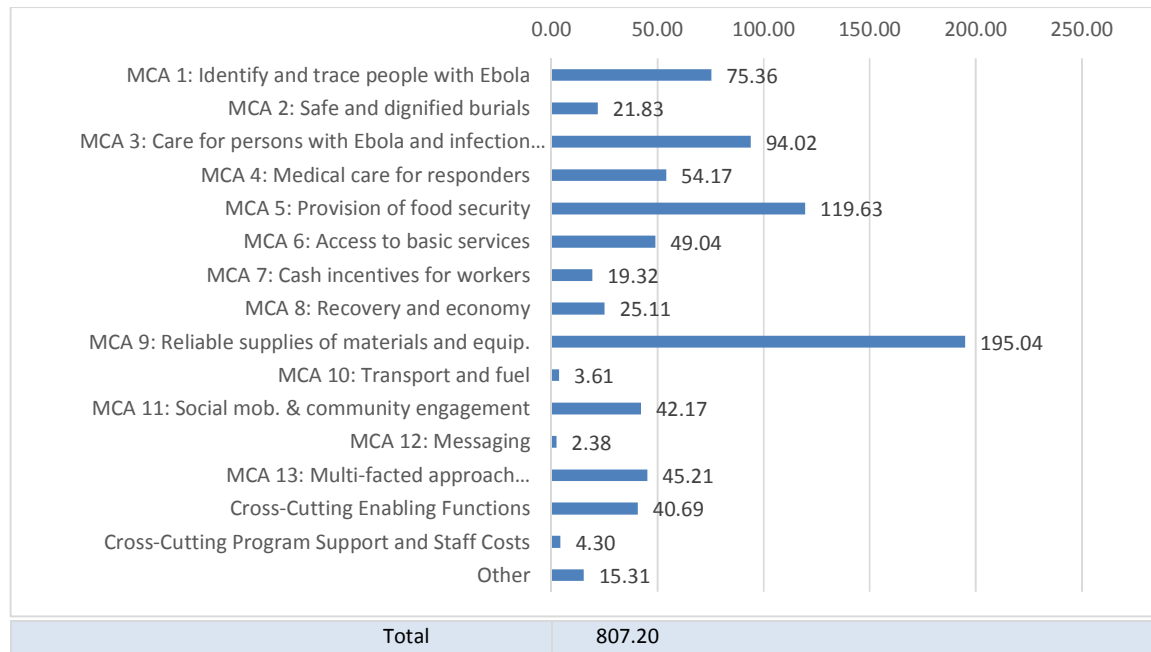
27. Recipients provided information on how funds were used to support Mission Critical Actions (MCAs), namely, the following activities identified as “mission critical” needs and requirements:

- MCA 1. Identify and trace people with Ebola
- MCA 2. Safe and dignified burials
- MCA 3. Care for persons with Ebola and infection control
- MCA 4. Medical care for responders
- MCA 5. Provision of food security and nutrition
- MCA 6. Access to basic (including non-Ebola health) services
- MCA 7. Cash incentives for workers
- MCA 8. Recovery and economy
- MCA 9. Reliable supplies of materials and equipment
- MCA 10. Transport and fuel
- MCA 11. Social mobilization and community engagement
- MCA 12. Messaging
- MCA 13. Prevent spread to other countries

C. Conclusion

30. According to the information made available about the funds pledged and disbursed by 46 contributing partners, from 1 September 2014 to 31 May 2015¹⁷:

- Contributing partners pledged a total of USD 6.6 billion, of which USD 4.6 billion were disbursed.
- The allocation of disbursed funds, disaggregated according to recipient category, has been:
 - Bilateral assistance to countries: 14%
 - International NGOs: 12%
 - International Organisations: 21%
 - Research institutions, Regional Organisations, local NGOs: 5%
 - MPTF: 2%
 - Affected-countries through additional IMF assistance, national institutions and departments of contributing partner governments¹⁸ and medevac service providers: 33%
 - Other recipients: 13%
- The geographic allocation of funds disbursed by the contributing partners has been:
 - Guinea: 13%
 - Liberia: 31%
 - Sierra Leone: 20%
 - Ebola-affected country (particular country not specified): 28%
 - Other country: 1%
 - Unspecified: 7%
- The allocation of disbursed funds by purpose has been:
 - Response: 71%
 - Recovery: 9%
 - Research and development: 4%
 - Other: 16%

31. According to the eight recipients that provided information for this report, during the period from 1 September 2014 to 31 May 2015:

- USD 807 million were expended.

- The geographic allocation of funds expended by the reporting recipients has been:
 - Guinea: 25%
 - Liberia: 31%
 - Sierra Leone: 32%
 - Regionally: 9%
 - Other: 3%

- The top three Mission Critical Actions for which funds have been used have been:
 - MCA 9 (Reliable supplies of materials and equipment): 24%
 - MCA 5 (Provision of food security and nutrition): 14%
 - MCA 1 (Identify and trace people with Ebola): 11%
